PPE 1004: Introduction to PPE (FYE Course)

Introduces students to important classic and contemporary texts in PPE. In addition, the course acquaints students with basic principles of research and writing.

PPE 2894: PPE Gateway Course

Integrates the quantitative techniques, conceptual tools, and core principles of philosophy, political science, and economics.

PPE 3884: PPE Topics Course

Allows students to discuss an interdisciplinary topic in PPE in depth, taught by experts in the field.
